Alliteration in Poetry. Alliteration is a term for repeated letter sounds (usually consonants, but not always) at the stressed part of two or more words. One example is “glowing golden grains.”Another word for alliteration is initial rhyme or head rhyme.. Ezra Pound’s “The Seafarer” uses several examples of alliteration.
